The IAC 1990 Hospitality Suite, with a spectacular skyline view of Seattle, became a favored location where old acquaintances were renewed and new ones formed. It's impossible to estimate the number of visitors to the suite but most states and provinces were represented as well as many foreign countries. (Mexico had a good representation.) A somewhat familiar event took place on Sunday after the closing ceremonies when a man from Italy came by after deciding to "come out". A small number of us were there to share our experience, strength, and hope in assuring him he wouldn't get drunk over it.

We are indebted to Randy for receiving the early shipment of materials necessary to operate the suite and to Lynn who helped organize the fist round of local volunteers. The success of the dance was due to the 1,300 who danced the night away. Here again volunteers with their dedication and commitment insured a smooth and timely entrance to the event. Everyone came away with the feeling of having attended a special event. The three gay/lesbian oriented workshops were well attended and certainly spirited!
